

A descriptive recreation activity patterns of international tourists in Tunku Abdul Rahman Park

Abstract

The purpose of this descriptive research is to identify the recreation participation pattern of international tourists in Tunku Abdul Rahman Park (TARP). A total sample of 100 respondents was obtained using convenient sampling technique. The findings indicated that recreation patterns were divided into active and passive recreation activities. Therefore, the recreation patterns are varied depending on the demographic characteristics and preferences of activities which the tourists are interested to participate specifically in the study area. Most of the respondents were first-time visitors and traveling with family. Social media was used as a platform to attain information regarding the TARP. The key attractions of TARP were the ocean, the seaside, and active recreation activities. Understanding recreation participation patterns will help park managers to access the tourists' needs and demand of recreational activities in TARP.
